Downlink 145.840MHz FM please do NOT transmit on this frequency! Uplink 144.450 MHz and 144.470MHz.

This mission will actually dock with MIR. The frequency change is to keep the very strong MIR signal from covering the weaker SAREX signal. Good Luck!
